A bachelor's degree in geoscience can prepare you for:

- 1. **Graduate school**, where you will specialize in a sub-discipline of the geosciences in preparation for mid-level or senior industry positions (M.S.), research positions (M.S. or Ph.D.) or professorships (Ph.D.)
- 2. **Jobs in a variety of sectors**, typically at entry-level, where you can apply the broad skills of a geoscience degree. Many graduates with a B.S. in geoscience will find jobs outside of the traditional geoscience roles, such as in communication, policy, or outreach.

Broad education in geoscience.

Typically required for entrylevel positions in the environmental geology industry, government, education, communication, and non-profit sectors.

Can I work in the **petroleum or mining industry** with a B.S?

Mining jobs tend to require at least a M.S. in economic geology. Oil company geologists working in exploration or research divisions are typically hired at the M.S. or Ph.D. levels.

Firms that contract with oil companies (e.g., GeoQuest software) may hire graduates with a B.S. for support work.

Can I work in the environmental geology industry with a B.S?

Environmental geology is a broad industry that frequently hires graduates with a B.S. or M.S. Salary and advancement will vary with educational level.

A geoscience degree provides a strong science background for teaching at a public or private school. Additional teaching certification(s) may be required for these positions.
